These are a few repetitive questions that have been asked of this office. We will compile them in hopes of these questions helping someone else.

1. Did the City or County declare us as a disaster like Columbus?
  - a. Yes, the City of West Point and County of Clay has made a declaration of disaster to be proactive. Both respective boards have the best interest of the citizens and visitors.
2. Are we under a curfew or lockdown?
  - a. No. We are not under a curfew or lockdown, but we do encourage the CDC recommendation of social distancing of 6ft and discouraging groups of people.
3. Does my business have to close its lobby?
  - a. We do not have any restrictions in place, but we do encourage the CDC recommendation of social distancing of 6ft and discouraging groups of people.
4. Are there any confirmed cases in Clay County?
  - a. As of today, there are no known confirmed cases in Clay County.
5. Will the West Point Parks and Recreation Sports still be played?
  - a. As of March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the West Point Parks and Recreation has suspended all activities and will reassess in two weeks. You can find more information at the Parks and Recs Facebook and Twitter social media pages.
6. What Schools are out and when to expect to return?
  - a. Hebron Christian School – Determination has not been made to return at this time.
  - b. Oak Hill Academy – Determination has not been made to return at this time.
  - c. West Point Consolidated School District – Mandated to remain closed until April 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020. See their website and Facebook page for further.
7. Wal-Mart is closing early, anything you can do?
  - a. Often the decisions to close early for corporation stores are that store and its corporation decision. They are following recommendations given. Businesses are closing early to protect their employees and patrons.
8. We will run out of tissue and supplies in West Point?
  - a. The stores will run out of supplies locally. As long as the shipping warehouses are shipping, it will just take time getting to the stores. Be sufficiently prepared, but not hoard.
9. The National Guard is being mobilized in some towns. Will that happen in West Point?
  - a. The National Guard has been activated by Governor Reeves for Directive 1459. They are not taking over. They will be assisting with mobile testing sites. With the amount of people coming to test, there has to be order and help.
