CALL TO ORDER/INVOCATION

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Scott. The welcome was given by Supervisor Horton with the invocation given by Calvin Boyd, Clay County Soil Conservation Commissioner.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Supervisor Deanes moved to adopt the agenda as prepared.

The motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis.

MR. CALVIN BOYD WITH THE CLAY COUNTY SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD TO INTRODUCE MS. NICOLE BARKSDALE AS NEW EMPLOYEE IN THAT OFFICE.

Mr. Calvin Boyd with the Clay County Soil Conservation Service appeared before the Board to introduce Ms. Nicole Barksdale as new employee at that office. Mr. Boyd will be splitting his time between Clay and Monroe Counties, but Ms. Barksdale will be the contact at the Clay County SCS office when he is unavailable.

RON THORNTON WITH THE GOLDEN TRIANGLE BOYS AND GIRLS' CLUB

Mr. Thornton had called prior to the meeting and requested to be on the agenda but was not present for the meeting. The Clerk reported she would follow up with him to reschedule his appearance before the Board.

ANDREW NOBLIN WITH AFFORDABLE EMPLOYEE BENEFITS APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD

Mr. Andrew Noblin with Affordable Employee Benefits appeared before the Board with a presentation of his company for the County. Mr. Noblin presented a quote for the County's Group Health Insurance along with other services provided through their benefit trust. The Board informed Mr. Noblin the County's Group Health policy year ran from July 1st through June 30th.

Supervisor Lummus moved to take the plan under advisement at this time.

MIRIAM DELGADO WITH GLOBE LIFE INSURANCE

Ms. Miriam Delgado with Globe Life Insurance asked for permission to speak with County employees regarding a Supplemental Income Program available through Globe Life Insurance for employees.

Supervisor Deanes moved to authorize and approve for Ms. Delgado to speak with County employees at their discretion. Ms. Delgado was instructed that there should not be an

interruption with the work flow of departments. This would not be County insurance, but would be conducted between the County employee and Ms. Delgado outside of work. Currently, the Board was of the opinion the County had enough insurance and was not willing to expand any coverages at this time.

PUBLIC HEARINGS AS NOTICED TO THE PUBLIC FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF PROPERTY AND STATE OF CLEANLINESS

A public hearing was conducted simultaneously on two properties. One property was owned by Amanda Thrash as located on 59 MHoon Valley Cove and the second property was owned by Michael Croft as located on Joe Myers Road. The President called the public hearing to order. He acknowledged both Mr. Croft and Mrs. Thrash were present for the hearing. The President informed both parties the Board had received petitions from adjacent property owners complaining of the State of Cleanliness of their property. President Horton explained to both parties as a property owner when we fail to maintain our property and keep it up, the Mississippi Code authorizes hearings such as this to take place. If the Board makes a finding that the property was in fact not being maintained properly, the County is, then, given the authority to clean the said property and charge their cost to clean the property back against the land. President Horton advised both property owners in the end it would be cheaper for you to maintain your own property. Both parties acknowledged they understood. President Horton asked the Board if there were any further questions or comments from them, in which, there was not.

Supervisor Davis acknowledged that both property owners, Ms. Amanda Thrash and Mr. Michael Croft, were noticed for the time and in the manner required by law to have their respective home/lots cleaned up. Supervisor Davis reported that both landowners had responded to the request for cleanup and he was pleased with the results from both landowners. Supervisor Davis expressed his regret that notice had to be given, but based upon the complaints he had received from adjoining landowners and neighbors, the notice had to be given.

Supervisor Deanes moved to close the public hearings on this matter.

The motion was seconded by Supervisor Lummus.

AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE TO DECLARE A DISASTER DUE TO THE LIGHTNING STRIKE AND EQUIPMENT FAILURE AT THE E911 OFFICES ON AUGUST 2, 2022

Mr. Williams advised the Board that on Tuesday, August 2, 2022 the E911 Center located on Broad Street was struck by Lightning. As a result of the lightning strike, all of the communication equipment, radio, phone, computer, NCIC, the camera system interior and exterior, tornado sirens, all was down. Mr. Williams advised the Board that currently he and his team are still assessing the damages, but he was requesting the Board to declare Tuesday's Lightning damage and equipment failure as a disaster as a result of the damage sustained by the 911 Center.

Supervisor Deanes moved to authorize and approve to declare a disaster due to the lightning strike and equipment failure at the E911 offices on August 2, 2022.

The motion was seconded by Supervisor Lummus.

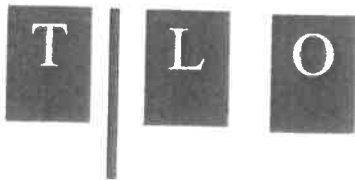
Re: Section 19-5-105 of Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended; Cleaning of Private Property;
Clay County, Mississippi

Dear Ms. Thrash:

Please be advised the Clay County Board of Supervisors has received complaints regarding the cleanliness of property owned by you at 59 Mhoon Valley Cv in Clay County, Mississippi. **The Board has set this matter for hearing at 9:00 a.m. on August 4, 2022, to be held at the Clay County Courthouse located at 205 Court Street in West Point.**

Section 19-5-105 of Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, requires that you be notified as follows regarding this matter:

1. An adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the board of supervisors to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of one (1) year after the hearing without any further hearing.
2. If at such hearing the board of supervisors shall in its resolution adjudicate such parcel of land in its then condition to be a menace to the public health and safety of the community, the board of supervisors may, if the owner not do so himself, proceed to have the land cleaned by cutting weeds, filling cisterns, and removing rubbish, dilapidated fences, outside toilets, dilapidated buildings and other debris, and draining cesspools and standing water.
3. Thereafter, the board of supervisors may at its next regular meeting by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the land and may also impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more.



(1) To determine whether property or a parcel of land located within a county is in such a state of uncleanness as to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, the board of supervisors of any county is authorized and empowered to conduct a hearing on its own motion, or upon the receipt of a petition requesting the board of supervisors to act signed by a majority of the residents eighteen (18) years of age or older, residing upon any street or alley, within reasonable proximity of any property alleged to be in need of cleaning, or within seven hundred fifty (750) feet of the precise location of the alleged menace situated on any parcel of land which is located in a populated area or in a housing subdivision and alleged to be in need of cleaning.

Notice shall be provided to the property owner by:

(a) United States mail two (2) weeks before the date of the hearing mailed to the address of the subject property and to the address where the ad valorem tax notice for such property is sent by the office charged with collecting ad valorem tax; and

(b) Posting notice for at least two (2) weeks before the date of a hearing on the property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of cleaning and at the county courthouse or another place in the county where such notices are posted.

The notice required by this subsection (1) shall include language that informs the property owner that an adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the board of supervisors to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of one (1) year after the hearing without any further hearing, if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at the county courthouse or another place in the county where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning. A copy of the required notice mailed and posted as required by this subsection (1) shall be recorded in the minutes of the board of supervisors in conjunction with the hearing required by this subsection.

If at such hearing the board of supervisors shall in its resolution adjudicate such parcel of land in its then condition to be a menace to the public health and safety of the community, the board of supervisors may, if the owner not do so himself, proceed to have the land cleaned by cutting weeds, filling cisterns, and removing rubbish, dilapidated fences, outside toilets, dilapidated buildings and other debris, and draining cesspools and standing water. Thereafter, the board of supervisors may at its next regular meeting by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the land and may also impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty shall become an assessment against the property. The "cost assessed against the property" means either the cost to the county of using its own employees to do the work or the

cost to the county of any contract executed by the county to have the work done, and administrative costs and legal costs of the county.

A county may reenter the property or parcel of land to maintain cleanliness without further notice of hearing no more than six (6) times in any twelve-month period with respect to removing dilapidated buildings, dilapidated fences and outside toilets, and no more than twelve (12) times in any twenty-four-month period with respect to cutting grass and weeds and removing rubbish, personal property and other debris on the land. The expense of cleaning the property shall not exceed an aggregate amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) per year, or the fair market value of the property subsequent to cleaning, whichever is less. The board of supervisors may assess the same penalty each time the property or land is cleaned as otherwise provided in this subsection (1).

The penalty provided in this subsection (1) shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi upon request for reimbursement under Section 29-1-145, nor shall a county clean a parcel owned by the State of Mississippi without first giving notice.

The assessment authorized by this subsection (1) shall be a lien against the property and may be enrolled in the office of the circuit clerk of the county as other judgments are enrolled, and the tax collector of the county shall, upon order of the board of supervisors, proceed to sell the land to satisfy the lien as now provided by law for the sale of lands for delinquent taxes. Furthermore, the property owner whose land has been sold pursuant to this subsection (1) shall have the same right of redemption as now provided by law for the sale of lands for delinquent taxes. All decisions rendered under the provisions of this subsection may be appealed in the same manner as other appeals from county boards.

(a) If private property or a parcel of land located within a county is a perpetual care cemetery subject to Section 41-43-1 et seq., the board of supervisors of the county may proceed pursuant to the same provisions of subsection (1) of this section used to determine whether a property is a public health menace to instead determine if the perpetual care cemetery and all structures on the cemetery are not being properly maintained and have become detrimental to the public health and welfare. A perpetual care cemetery that is "not being properly maintained and has become detrimental to the public health and welfare" means a perpetual care cemetery that shows signs of neglect, including, without limitation, the unchecked growth of vegetation, repeated and unchecked acts of vandalism, unusable entrances and exits, excess rubbish or debris, or the disintegration of grave markers or boundaries. Upon notice and opportunity to be heard as provided in subsection (1) of this section, the board of supervisors of the county may adjudicate the property or parcel of land in its then condition to be not properly maintained and detrimental to the public health and welfare, and if the owner does not do so itself, may proceed to clean the property or parcel of land as provided in subsection (1) of this section. When cleaning the property or parcel of land of a perpetual care cemetery pursuant to this subsection (2), the penalty or penalties provided in subsection (1) of this section shall not be assessed against owners of the perpetual care cemeteries.

(b) The board of supervisors of a county that cleans property or parcel of land of a perpetual care cemetery pursuant to this subsection (2) may make application to the Secretary of State for an order directing the trustee of the perpetual care cemetery trust fund to release accrued interest or principal of the trust fund sufficient to reimburse the county for only the actual cleanup costs incurred by the county. The application to the Secretary of State shall include a statement by the county that all of the requirements of this section have been met.

(c) If the Secretary of State is satisfied that the notice and hearing requirements of this section have been met, and that the application for an order directing the trustee to release accrued interest of the perpetual care cemetery trust fund does not threaten the ability of the trust fund to provide for the care and maintenance of the cemetery, the Secretary of State may order the trustee to release up to the total amount of accrued interest of the trust fund in an amount sufficient to reimburse the county for the actual costs of cleanup performed by the county.

(d) If the Secretary of State is satisfied that the notice and hearing requirements of this section have been met, but makes a determination that the accrued interest of the perpetual care cemetery trust fund is insufficient to reimburse the county for the actual costs of cleanup performed by the county, or that an order to release accrued interest would threaten the ability of the trust fund to provide for the care and maintenance of the cemetery, the Secretary of State

may consider an order directing the trustee to reimburse the county from the principal of the trust fund. If the Secretary of State determines that an order to the trustee to release principal from the trust fund will not threaten the solvency of the trust fund, the Secretary of State may order the trustee to release principal of the trust fund in an amount sufficient to reimburse the county for the actual costs of cleanup performed by the county.

(i) The Secretary of State may not order the trustee to release an amount of more than fifteen percent (15%) of principal of the trust fund to reimburse the county for the actual costs of cleanup performed by the county.

(ii) The provisions of this section may be utilized no more than once in a four-year period.

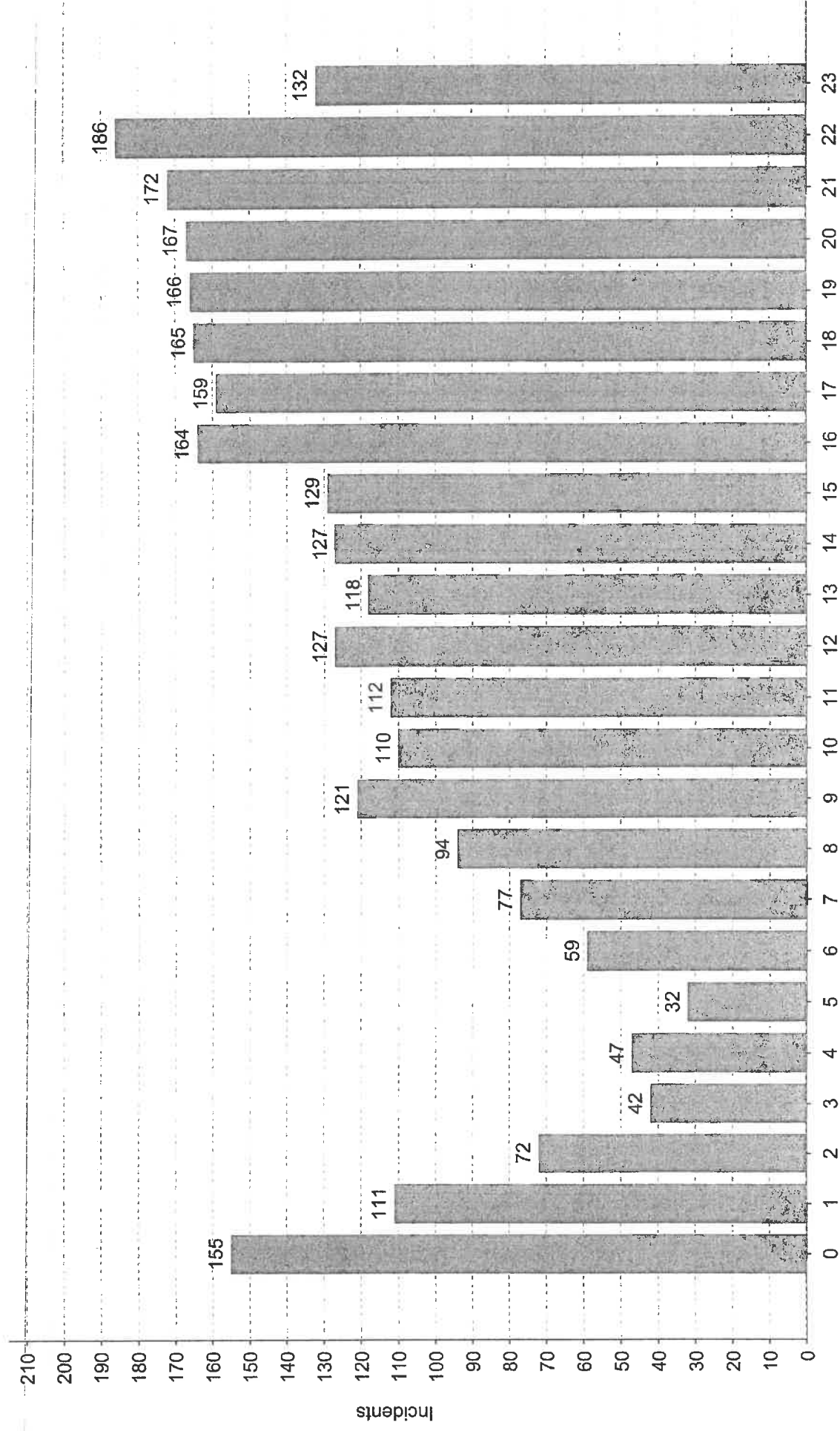
